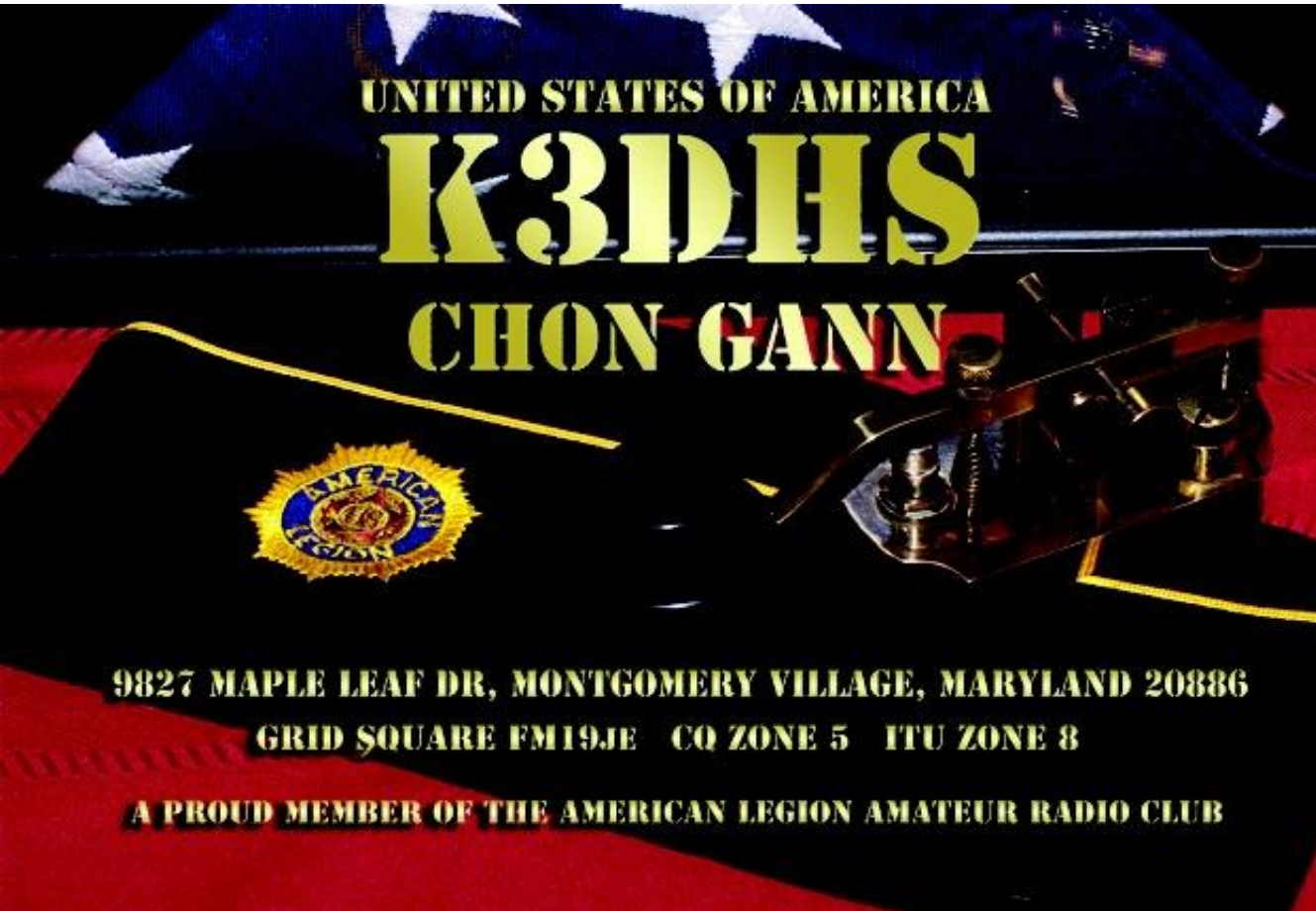

Military Auxiliary Radio System

MARS - contingency radio communications support to U.S. Government operations...through the utilization of organized volunteer radio operators...under appropriate authorities, as directed by and coordinated within the DoD. (DoDI 4650.2)

- Provide contingency radio communications support to the DoD Components
- Provide contingency radio communications support to civil authorities at all levels
- Provide health, morale, and welfare radio communications support...when in remote or isolated areas, in contingencies or whenever appropriate





The Army Mission



Military Auxiliary Radio System

Army MARS mission is to support a global HF Enterprise in cyber impaired or denied environments on behalf of the U.S. Army and DoD, in order to support objectives of the United States

Three Primary Tasks:

- Provide radio communications support by staffing the Global High Frequency Enterprise Radio Network (GHFERN)
- Support DoD Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) efforts by interfacing with the Amateur Radio Community
- Provide temporary disaster communications support to Federal, State, and Local Civil Authorities until military support is no longer required

The Secondary Mission

- Training cadets, soldiers and guardsman in HF radio fundamentals
- Processing Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) related messages and telephone calls to or from U.S. Servicemen and women located throughout the world, commonly known as the “MARSGRAMS”

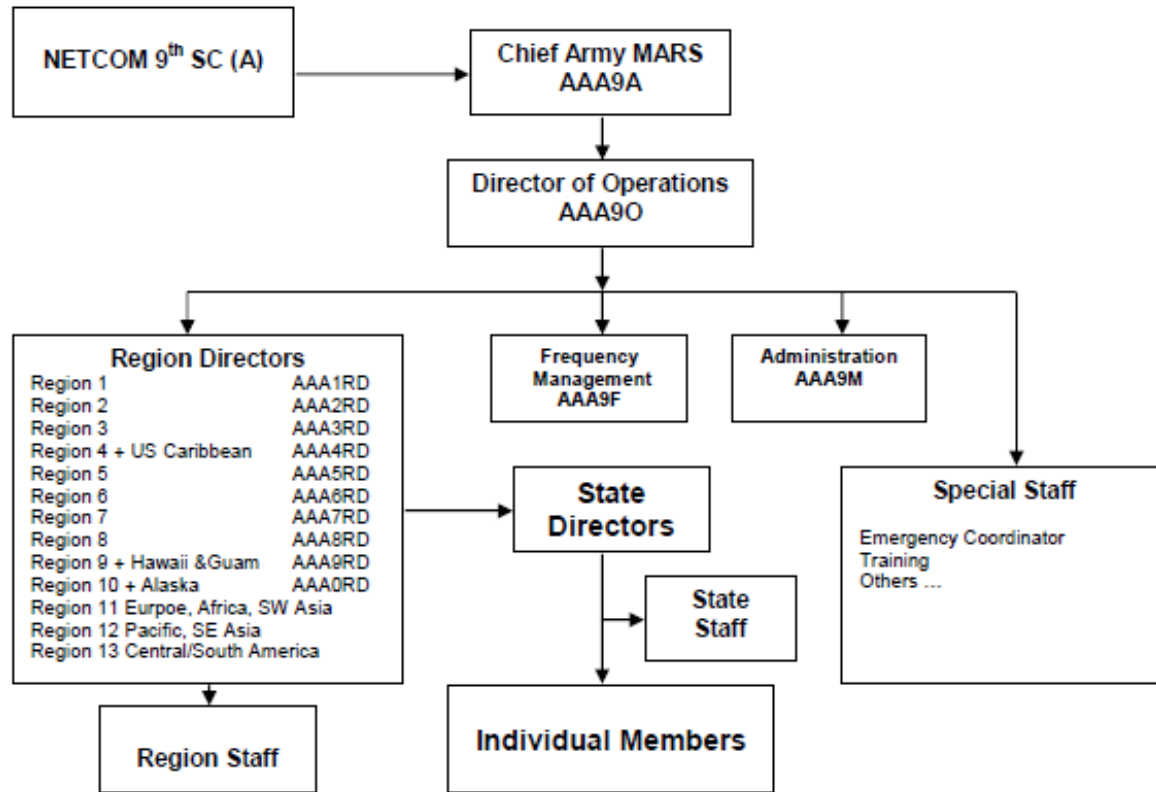

Military Auxiliary Radio System

Mission

(U) Local coordination with available amateur radio resources

(U) Demonstrate interoperability between DOD networks, government, and amateur radio stations.

Intent

(U) Establish and maintain dependable, multi-layer HF radio-only Network communications to support DOD objectives and interface with relevant amateur radio networks and required to fulfill DOD requirements.

Military Auxiliary Radio System

Amateur Radio operators represent the Nation's reservoir of electronic and communications experts. It is through the service of these citizen volunteers that MARS is able to accomplish its mission.



MARS Operators:

- Communicate effectively and concisely utilizing specific protocols and procedures across all approved HF/VHF bands and modes
- Utilizing the effects of the ionosphere apply techniques to maximize the radio frequency path between two points of communications
- Operate and maintain HF/VHF radio equipment, antennas, and telecommunications technology
- Utilize computers in conjunction with radio equipment, various software, soft-modems, while maintaining operating systems and secure computer systems

❖ Note – MARS operations is primarily a HF operating environment

Military Auxiliary Radio System

Qualifications

- Adult - U.S. Citizen (18yrs >)
- FCC Amateur Radio License
- Pass a background check
- Agree to follow the rules, regulations, and procedures prescribed by the U.S. Army

Training

- Complete FEMA's Incident Command System (ICS)100 and 200
- Achieve General of higher FCC Amateur Radio License within first year.
- Complete Basic Training within first six months



Activity and Equipment



Military Auxiliary Radio System

- Maintain ATO, which requires current FCC Amateur Radio License
- Perform a minimum of 72 - hours of service every year
- Usually 18 hours per quarter.
- Participate in at least one quarterly COMEX per year
- **Non-MARS radio activity does not meet HF requirement**
- Have/Modify a radio station capable of RX/TX on both SSB voice and digital between 2-30MHz
- Equipment must meet NTIA technical parameters
- Have computer compatible with MIL-STD software and messaging formats
- Internet and email service



Tasks



Military Auxiliary Radio System

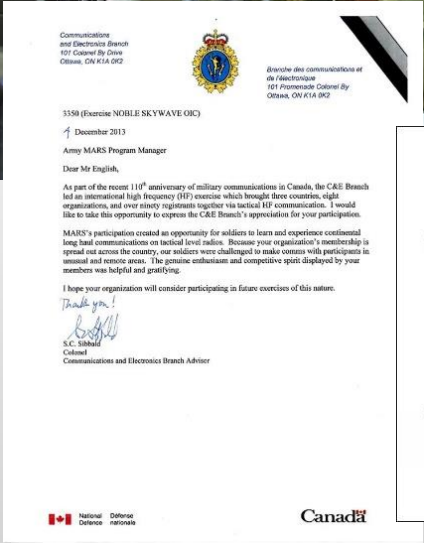
- Routinely check into MARS nets
- Train to be an NCS on MARS nets
- RX/TX messages using MIL-STD waveforms and ACP message text formats
- Encode and Decode using provided MARS military software
- Train in at least one annual DoD Exercise
- Daily and Weekly Nets
 - (State, Regional, National, Global)
- Weekly Training Nets
- Weekly Admin Nets
- MIL-STD ALE Nets
- Quarterly Exercises
- Annual Events
 - Armed Forces Day
 - QRP Exercise
 - Operation Christmas Cracker
 - Regional Conference

- Serving America for over 65 years





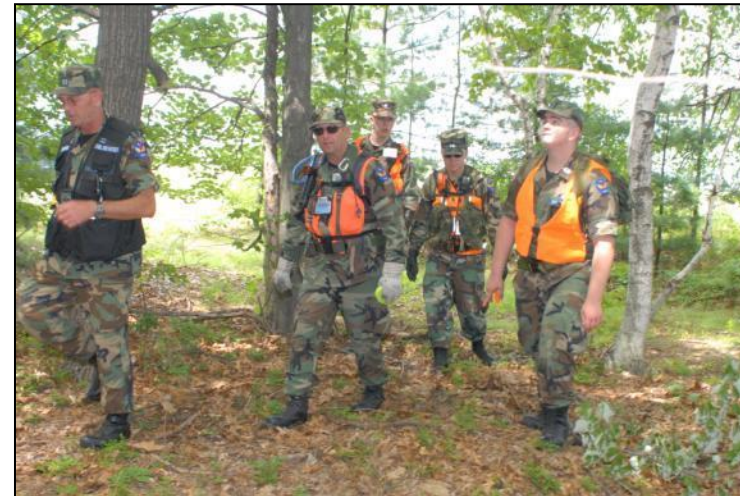

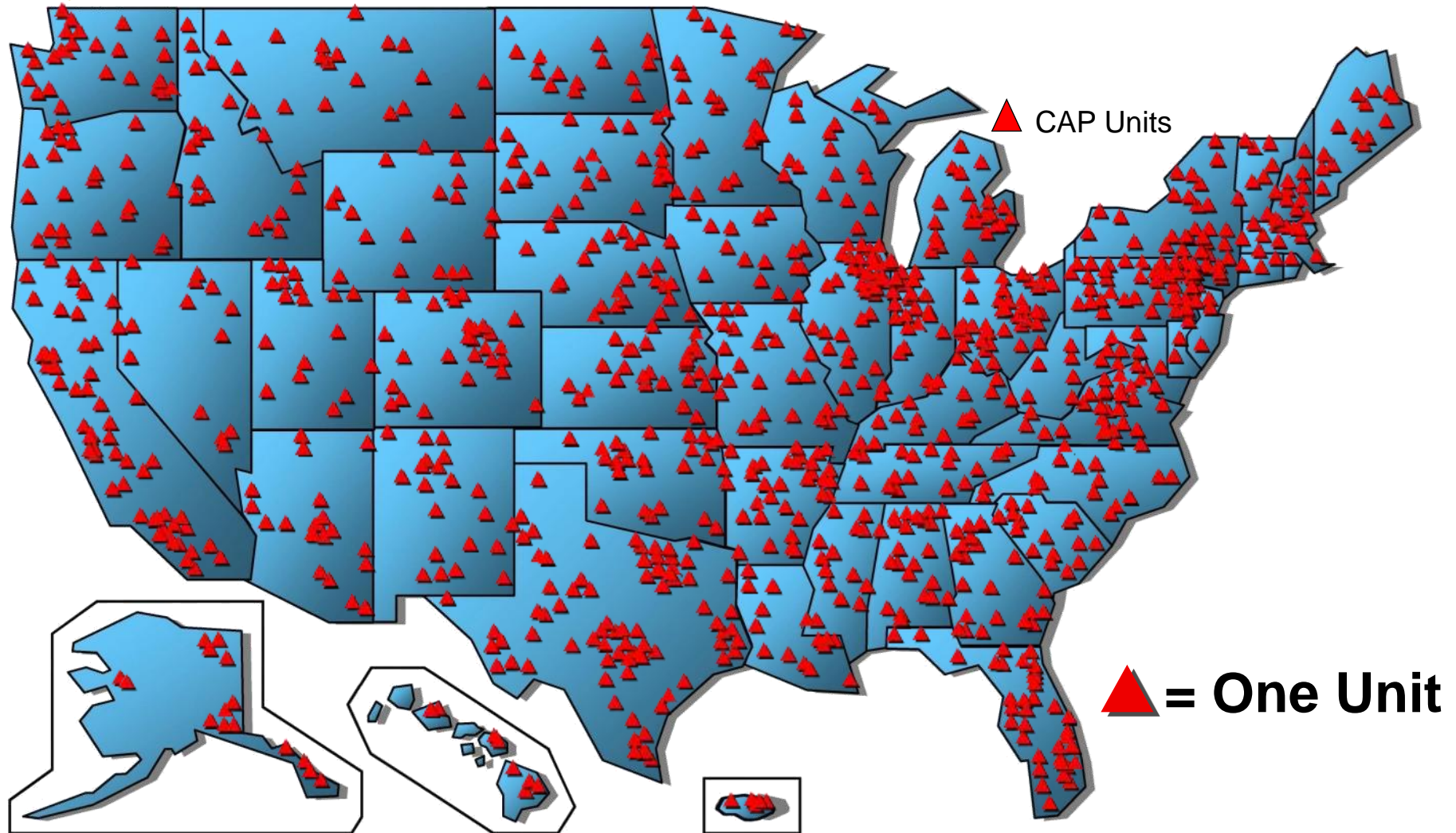
